End of term

Safeguarding

My Child at School App

Next term we will be moving from Class Charts to 'My Child at School' which is the App that works with our Management Information System, Bromcom. Class Charts will no longer work from the end of this academic year, but we should be able to transfer positive points to Bromcom. This will allow families to see attendance, home learning, positives and negatives and payments. More details will be sent in September and support will be available where needed. We will do all we can to snag any problems before the roll out, but experience shows there may be 'bumps in the road'!

Delta

As families will know, Coast and Vale Learning Trust is working with Delta Learning Trust and has Paul Tarn as CEO. There has been lots of activity over the last 7 weeks with our colleagues at Delta, sharing resources and building professional networks. I know Paul Tarn is keen to get families together to share his vision for investing in education for Scarborough and Ryedale. The General Election has paused the work of the Department for Education and meant that the work with the Regional Schools Commissioner and Headteachers Board has been held up. Following the summer, I hope that Paul Tarn will be writing to families of Lady Lumley's to update them.
