Drop-Off at School

EYFS

The school gates for children in EYFS (Reception) are open from 8:50 - 9:00am. After this, the gates will be locked, and your child will need to be brought to the main office.

KS1

The school gates for KS1 (Year 1 and Year 2) are open from 8:40 - 8:50am on a morning. After 8:50am the gates will be locked, and your child will need to be brought to the main office.

KS2

The school gates for KS2 (Years 3 to 6) are open from 8:40 - 8:50am on a morning. After 8:50am the gates will be locked, and your child will need to be brought to the main office.

Collection from School

EYFS

The school gates will open at 3:20pm, parents should collect their children, and follow the path round past EYFS, to exit via the EYFS gate.

KS1

The school gates for KS1 (Year 1 and Year 2) will open at 3:10pm. Parents should enter through the first set of gates, collect their children and follow the path round past EYFS, to exit via the EYFS gate. The gates will then be locked to allow the EYFS children to line up.

KS2

The school gates for KS2 (Years 3 to 6) will open at 3:10pm. Parents should enter the school playground from the top gates, collect their children from the playground and then exit via the gates on the bottom playground. Year 5 and 6 pupils for whom we have received the correct consent will be allowed to walk home alone.

We understand that some parents have children to drop off and collect from both KS1 and KS2 entrances, your children will remain with their class teachers until you have collected other siblings.
