


Class OC & OS

The children had a fantastic afternoon; asking questions, listening and holding the owls. This kick-started our Talk for Writing book this half term - Owl Babies. I wonder if your child can retell the story, remembering some of the actions we have learnt? We also took part in our first PE lesson. The children were brilliant at getting changed and following the rules and routines in a new environment. We have also started phonics this week and learnt the first four sounds; S A T P.

Class 3C & 3WR

The children were very excited to come into the classroom on Monday morning to a crime scene which linked to our new Talk for Writing unit - Little Red. The children showed excellent detective skills and were able to make predictions about what might have happened.

In history, we have been learning about BC and AD. We have explored the chronology of some historical eras/key events and have created our own timelines. Did you know that the dinosaurs and humans never coexisted? This is one of the facts we have learnt this week.

In art, we have started to explore cave paintings and have analysed the colours, subjects and tones used.



Class 45 & 4M


A full week in year 4 has flown by. We have settled in well and now have well established routines.

This week in science we have been learning all about animal teeth. We did not even recognise the image of the snakes fangs! We have also begun learning about the Vikings, thinking about where they were chronologically and who they were.

We have now read three chapters of Edward Tulane and the children are really engrossed in the book.

We did have some mysteries in year 4 this week. Finding part of a mysterious scroll we have been thinking carefully about 'the curse of the golden ring'. The children have been really excited by this which will lead into their writing sessions.

Year 5

Class 5G & 5BT

We have had a busy week of reading in Year 5. The children have been making some great predictions about our new book 'Street Child' and are intrigued to know more after exploring the blurb.

In science we have been learning about the types of eggs animals lay. Some interesting questions were asked. This followed on from our learning last week about life cycles.

The children had to be archaeologists on Monday morning after a mysterious tip off about Roman artefacts in our school grounds. Pottery was found (who knows, maybe Roman?!) but our big find was a golden snake bracelet! This turned out to be just like the bracelet in our Talk for Writing hook! Can the children recall the story at home?

Class 5G's first swimming lesson went...swimmingly! The children were fantastic and once again, the swimming instructors complimented them on their listening skills!



Class 6BA & 6BL

Year 6 have had another busy and jam-packed week. The start to the week was a rather disrupted one: the children had to put together the clues to work out who (or what) had wrecked the classroom over the weekend. The blood spatters, severed fingers, knocked over tables and chairs and brown fur scattered could only mean one thing - a monster had been let loose in the classroom! We hope this will inspire their future writing.





Aside from this, the children have been learning to re-tell the story, 'The Tibicena' by using a story map in their Talk for Writing sessions. 'Black saliva hung from its jaws; two razor-sharp teeth protruded downwards...' They have also started analysing the book, 'Black Powder' in reading sessions. All children will be coming home with a reading for pleasure book also today!
