Staff and students at Lady Lumley's Sixth Form are collectively striving to "be our best". Alex Carter, Head of Sixth Form of Lady Lumley's, and Donna Hugill, the Sixth Form Pastoral Manager, explain more about the school's ethos ahead of its open evening.

The school is ambitious for our students, support them in their progress towards career and life goals and truly value personal as well as academic development.

In 2024 OFSTED described it as a place where "students in the sixth form are proud to be at Lady Lumley's. They value the positive relationships that they have with staff.

"One student told the inspectors 'it is like being part of a family'. This comment was typical of many others."

Lucy Tingay, one of the Headteacher's Ambassadors says: "The main reason I chose to study at Lady Lumley's sixth form is the personal relationship with my teachers, and their investment in my aspirations. While reading psychology, biology and sociology, with the hope of studying psychology at Cambridge, I constantly feel supported and encouraged to do the best I can while my teachers go out of their way to help me reach my goals. I find the size of the sixth form is a great fit for me and believe that the sense of community we have is unusual and wouldn't be possible without this."

Our outcomes give our students life chances, the product of an environment that supports and challenges students to truly thrive.

A total of 85% of students in 2024 achieved their first-choice university place, against a national average of 76%.

Students make rapid progress through high-quality teaching and learning and student commitment, opportunities exist for students to flourish.

We are very much looking forward to Year 11 students joining us in

Year 12 and then preparing for two years to take the next step of employment, university, or higher-level apprenticeships.

Through a personal development curriculum, sixth form students are supported to develop as people and academics.

Across tutor time, life lessons and assemblies, skills and mindsets are focused on to ensure students make rapid progress and become outstanding members of the local, national, and global community. Our enriched learning environment includes our Aspire group for higher level critical thinking; the excellent Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award; trips abroad to Paris and Berlin for our Art and MFL students; outdoor education visits to the local North York Moors; careers conventions across the region; the Extended

Project for students to really dive intellectually into an area they are highly interested in; a London trip for all;

subject visits to university workshops where our students get to work with university professors and lots more!



Sixth Form Teambuilding Trip to North Yorkshire Waterpark

On 25 September 2024, our sixth form students took part in an exciting teambuilding trip to North Yorkshire Waterpark. The day was filled with adventure and challenges as students participated in activities designed to foster integration, resilience, and new friendships.

The main attraction was the Aquapark, a thrilling inflatable obstacle course on the water. Students worked together to navigate the floating platforms, slides, and climbing walls, developing teamwork and communication skills in the process. There were plenty of laughs and splashes as they supported each other through the various challenges.





Students then took to the water again for paddleboarding. Many tried this activity for the first time, learning the importance of perseverance and balance. Some embraced the challenge quickly, while others showed real determination in staying afloat!





There was also the opportunity for some students to explore a WW II escape room. The mission was to solve intricate puzzles and crack codes to aid courageous pilots of 215 squadron at RAF West Ayton.

The trip's main goal was to help students build new connections and develop resilience through shared experiences. It was wonderful to see students from different tutor groups and schools working together and forming lasting friendships. The day was a huge success, and everyone returned home with great memories and a stronger sense of community within our sixth form.

We look forward to more trips like this in the future as part of our exciting enrichment programme!

Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze update - Year 10

This is a gentle reminder that by now, students should have attended the introductory eDofE meeting and your child should be fully signed into the eDofE platform. Please ensure that your child has completed the following:

- 1. Personal Details: All personal information must be accurately entered into eDofE.
- 2. **Section Plans**: Your child should have added full details for their volunteering, skill and physical sections, outlining the activities they are undertaking.

Looking ahead, we are excited to inform you that more details regarding the January practice expedition will be announced very soon. The cost will be approximately £140 for both the practice expedition at Peat Rigg and the qualifying expedition in July. As always, please speak to Mr Mann in confidence if there are any financial barriers.

Please note, to be eligible to attend the expedition, students must have an **up-to-date eDofE account** and have uploaded at least **one** assessor's report.

For any assistance or if your child is experiencing difficulties with eDofE, please encourage them to see Mr. Mann, who is available to offer support.

A Level Biology Fieldwork

Friday 27th September saw the Year 13 biology class head off onto the moors for a day of fieldwork. It must be said, conditions could have been better! Heavy rain the day before made conditions underfoot rather damp to say the least, and the high winds made for a bracing walk to the study site. Thankfully, the site itself was generally more sheltered, the rain stayed away, blue sky prevailed, and the sun even made an appearance! Expert briefing regarding the local flora was on hand from Tanya Eyre, the Education Officer for Fylingdales Moor, who supports us each year with our visit. The fieldwork facilitates collection of the data needed to complete the required practical where students investigate the effect of a named environmental factor on the distribution of a given species.

Given the demanding conditions on the day, the students were fantastic! They were positive and enthusiastic, organised and methodical, and not a grumble to be heard – they definitely earned their bonus chocolate buttons!

Finally, a special mention to Millie for going over-and -above by carrying extra fieldwork kit around all day; and to Mr Maczka for rolling back the years and supporting with his ecological expertise!
