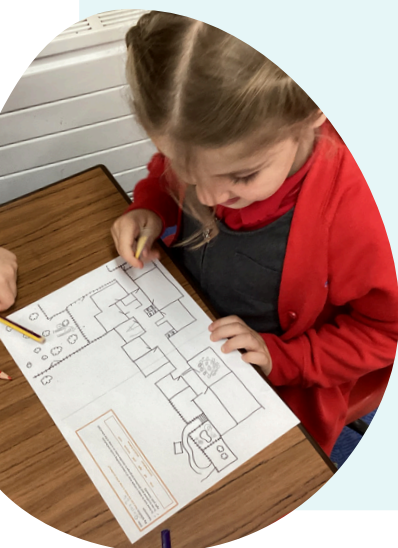


## Class 0C & 0S

This week we have continued to learn about the four seasons and the signs of Autumn. On Monday, we went on an Autumn walk around the school grounds and saw lots of signs! We found lots of leaves that had fallen off the trees and changed colour. We went to the orchard and found lots of fallen apples. The children were desperate to taste them so we decided that next week we are going to bake apple crumble and use our cutting skills to chop the apples safely.

When we returned to the classroom we read Leafman which inspired us to create our own Leaf characters using the Autumnal objects we collected.

## Year 1

### Class 1A & 1S

This week we have been writing our own version of the Three Little Pigs. We are doing a great job at trying to remember finger spaces and full stops.

In art we have continued to look at collage and Jeannie Baker's work. We practised cutting and tearing different materials.

In geography we have thought about which are the special human and physical features of our school. We drew them on a map and have marked a route for our friends to follow next week, we hope they won't get lost!



## Class 2S & 2MT

This week we have enjoyed beginning to create collages in Art after taken inspiration from the work of David Hockney. In small groups we are using different colours, materials and photographs to create our own collages of 'The Shard'. We collaborated so well together and look forward to sharing more about our art work with you once they are finished!

In geography this week we have learnt about what landmarks are and explored the Big Picture Book of London to locate and recognise famous landmarks along the River Thames.

In science we really enjoyed investigating different objects to see what happened to them when we bent, stretched, squashed or twisted them. We predicted whether the slinky or the noodle would stretch the furthest - ask your children which one was the longest when stretched!



## Class 3C & 3WR

On Tuesday, as part of our writing launch for our new unit of learning based on explanation texts, the children entered the classroom to the music from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. We watched a short clip from the film (where the characters enter the chocolate room) and then created list poems based on what they would do if they were in a World of Imagination. George wrote, *'In a world of pure imagination, I would swim in the marvellous, melting chocolate that flows in the graceful river.'*

In science, we have made sedimentary rock and created our own fossils. The fossils formed over millions of years (over the weekend). The children were very excited to observe the results. We have also learnt about weathering and how it affects rock.

In art, the children have experimented with layering pastels, charcoal and graphite pencils to create cave drawings.

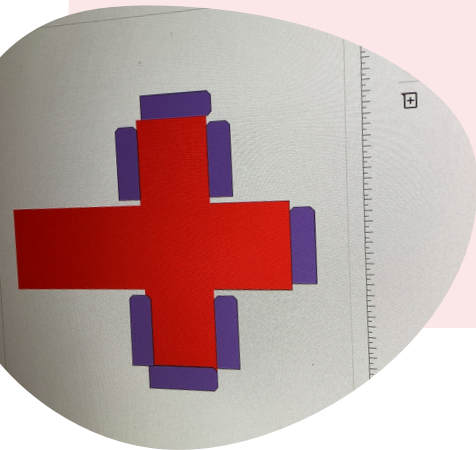


## Class 4S & 4M

Year 4 have continued to write their warning stories. This week we wrote our build up and problem part of our stories, using careful choices of verbs, adding personification and dropping our reader straight into the action. In maths, we have continued with our addition and subtraction unit, moving on to more problem solving and in reading Edward Tulane (now known as Clyde?!) has found himself in a field, being used as a scarecrow.



In DT, we began to explore CAD (Computer Assisted Design) to learn how to design a net that could be useful when creating our Viking longships. We learned more about their use and design in history too.



## Year 5

### Class 5G & 5BT

We had a great time in class 5BT this week. In PSHE we have been learning about rewards and consequences. The children enjoyed making up their own team games. They were great at explaining the rules and how to win their game. We discussed how it felt to win and lose.

In science we observed the vegetables from last week and discussed if asexual reproduction had occurred. The spring onions have left a lovely stench in our classrooms.

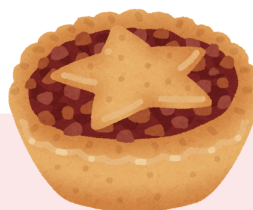
We have seen some great, creative ideas coming through in our 'hot write' portal story this week. We are continuing to work on 'show don't tell' in our writing, as well as mastering punctuation.

## Class 6BA & 6BL

Year 6 have had lots of experience working in groups this week, learning to respect each others' ideas, listen well and respond appropriately. They have learnt to take turns and be a valuable member in both their PSHE lessons and during their Science lessons. They have also discussed the impact that someone's behaviour can have on the group.



In Science, they worked together to both research and build a model of blood. They discovered the key components and their functions and demonstrated it with Cheerios, mini marshmallows and lots of teamwork!

The children were shocked to hear some of the bizarre laws from hundreds of years ago during their reading sessions: ask them what they now know about football and mince pies!

Maths has been a challenge for everybody this week as the children have been learning long division - they have tried really hard!

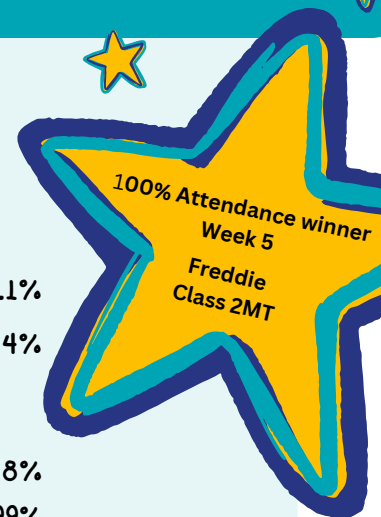
