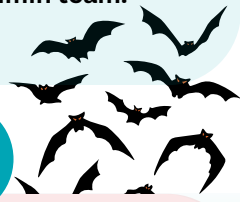

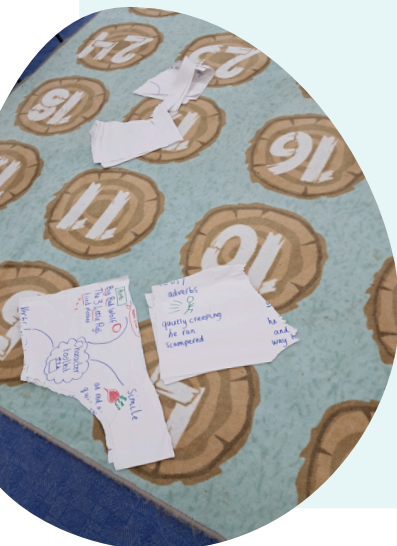
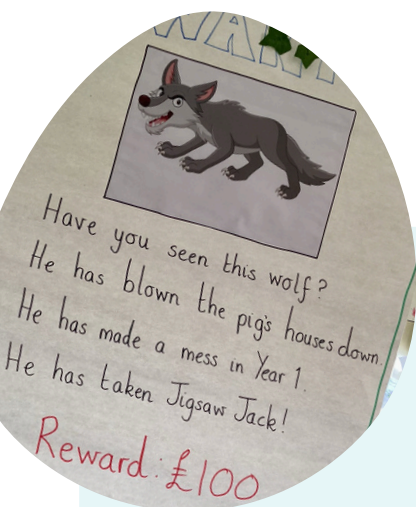


Class OC & OS

What a brilliant half term in EYFS! The children have worked so hard! We have finished our writing topic on 'Owl Babies'. The children have worked so hard to become familiar with the story and it was fantastic to hear their very own versions of the story!

Halloween has begun in EYFS this week! We have been using our knife skills to carefully carve shapes into pumpkins, our PSHE lesson helped with this as Jigsaw Jenie taught us all about being responsible. We have been working hard to create spooky collages, practising careful cutting skills.

In phonics this week we have been reviewing some sounds we have learnt already. These are k, n, u and e. Can you spot these sounds in any words over the half term break?



Year 1

Class 1A & 1S

Wow! What a busy half term we have had in Year 1. We are now all settled into the routine of Year 1 and the expectations that come with it. The children are really starting to shine.

There was great excitement in year 1 this week when we came in to find a huge mess in our classroom and a wanted poster for The Big Bad Wolf. He even took Jigsaw Jack!! We are working hard of writing instructions for how to trap the Big Bad Wolf so we can get Jigsaw Jack back.

In phonics this week we have been reviewing the digraphs we have learnt this half term. They are: ay, ou, ie, ea, oy, ir, ue, aw, wh, ph, ew and oe. You can help us by spotting them in words whilst we are reading.



Class 2S & 2MT

This week in writing, we completed our 'hot task' of writing a recount in the form of a postcard. Pupils have worked really hard to include the skills we have been working on such as writing in the past tense and including sequential language.

We had a great afternoon using the boom whackers in our music lesson and we really enjoyed creating pictures of book covers using our ipads in ICT. In RE we created hanging mobiles with pictures and information on everything we've learnt in our topic of Judaism this half term.

2S were very excited this week as we were the first class in school to have 12 days of 100% attendance and received a special McDonalds delivery of a McFlurry each to celebrate!

We have really loved the opportunity to meet lots of you at parents evening this week and are really proud of all of Year 2 for how they have settled in this year.



Class 3C & 3WR

In reading this week, the children have been exploring an acrostic poem on pollution. The children thoroughly enjoyed performing the poem in front of their peers.

In writing, the children were able to show off their science knowledge when they created detailed explanation texts all about the process of fossilisation. You could ask the children what features they used in their writing to engage the reader and make their text easy to follow.

In Art, the children have used pastels and charcoal to create some large scale cave paintings inspired by the artist Laura Barbosa.

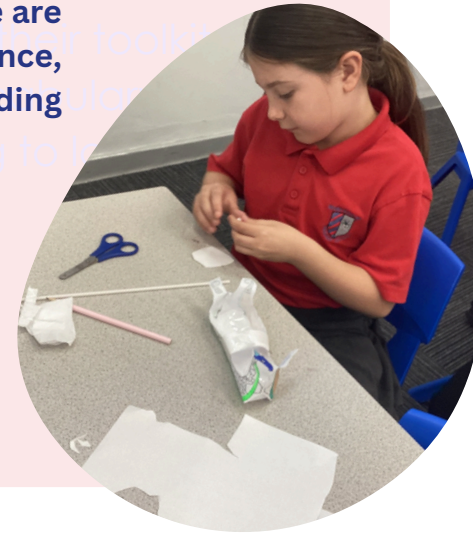


Class 4S & 4M

In DT, we have finished our Viking Longships. We loved sharing them with EYFS, and seeing if the shell structures were sturdy enough.

Class 5G & 5BT

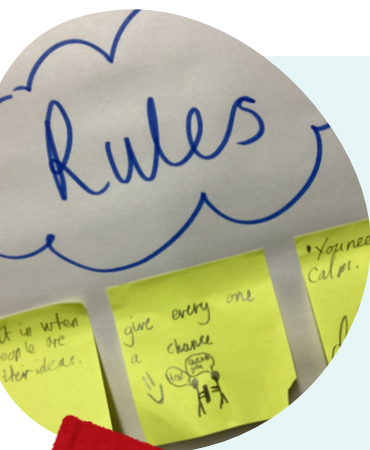
This week, the children have enjoyed writing their explanations of their made up animals (or should we say hybrid species if we are keeping it formal?!)

Our geography unit also finished, with the children producing some fantastic information posters to share everything they have learned.

In PSHE we have been discussing why group work is often challenging so we made up some rules to abide by.

It was lovely to see so many of you at parents' evening and to see how proud the children were to share their learning with you. Well done for this half-term Year 5 and have an enjoyable break!



Class 6BT & 6B

They have shown good progress in their narrative writing and have all used editing effectively to improve their stories. In Maths, they have been applying their knowledge of division into worded problems and unpicked different vocabulary that may mean divide.



They have completed the first part of the PSHE jigsaw, 'Being Me in my World' and have learnt about how their actions have consequences both in school and globally. They have also learnt about how to work well in a group, using democratic systems. They have completed their PE unit on 'Health related exercise', using circuits and exercises to improve their fitness. They are all ready for a well-deserved break!
