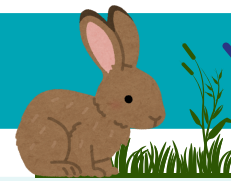
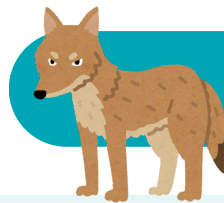
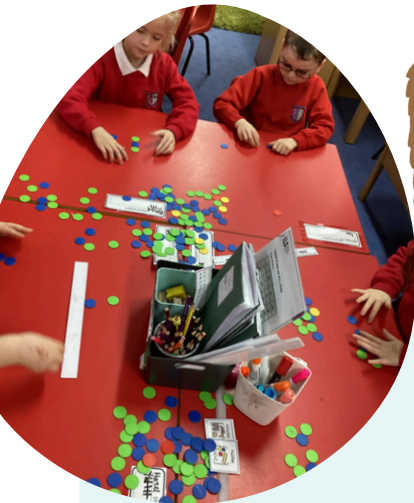
Class OC & OS

We have had an exciting week in EYFS!

We have begun our learning on castles and have enjoyed designing and creating our own castles in the building area! The children have worked hard to correctly label the features of their castle.

In the outside area, we have introduced the bikes. The children have shown resilience in the face of a challenge and kept trying to achieve their goals!

We have continued learning about Barbara Hepworth and experimented with clay. The children have used tools to create different sized and shape imprints, they can't wait to make their own sculptures!



Year 1

Class 1A & 1S

We have had a very busy week in year 1!

In Maths we have started a new unit of multiplication and division. We have been looking at making equal groups and arrays using columns and rows.

Using images of different animals, the children have identified different physical features and diets to determine if the animal is a herbivore, carnivore or omnivore. This topic was linked to our history lesson where the children have been looking at dinosaurs throughout history and identifying what kind of foods they ate.

In phonics the children have been going over all of the earlier alternative phase 5 graphemes.





Class 2S & 2MT

We have been busy completing our 'hot task' in writing, creating our own fantasy story! We have focused on trying to include similes, sentences of 3 and exclamations in our independent writing and are so proud of the work we have produced!

In science we have explored how exercise affects the body and used a stethoscope to listen to each other's heartbeats before and after exercise. We also learnt about the importance of eating a balanced diet and exercising to keep ourselves healthy.

In art we have continued to develop the skill of weaving with different materials and have started to create a flower from our designs. In maths we began a new topic 'money' and have been counting in pence and pounds.

We went to Mexico on Wednesday, to begin our new geography topic. We had our passports and boarding passes ready and boarded the plane. We are looking forward to finding out lots more about Mexico next week!



Class 3C & 3WR

We have just finished our Maths unit on fractions, and the children have done an amazing job! They showed great resilience, especially when tackling tricky questions about finding non-unit fractions of groups of objects.

In Geography, we have been learning all about coastal erosion and sea defences. Next Monday, we will be going on our field trip to see these in action! It will be great to spot real examples of what we have been studying. Make sure your child comes to school in their uniform, with a warm, waterproof coat, and comfortable, sturdy shoes – we'll be outside, so it's important to stay dry and cozy!

In Science, we have been learning all about materials and shadows. We discovered that opaque materials work best for casting shadows. After that, we had a fantastic time creating our very own shadow puppets and testing them out to see how they worked!





Class 4S & 4M

Wow what a busy week, We couldn't be prouder of all of the children at Dallowgill. They have been so supportive of one another, encouraging each other up the leap of faith, comforting those of us that were missing home and just being amazing friends to one another.



We packed so many things into our time away: scrambling around Brimham rocks, shelter building, leap of faith, low ropes, woodland walks, s'mores, chants around the firepit and a movie night to name a few. What a brilliant time we had! Tired children and adults on our return but so worth it for the adventures and memories. We would love to share some of these memories with you at our Dallowgill parent event on Tuesday after school.



Class 5G & 5BT

We are enjoying reading the children's 'hot write' suspense stories and seeing the techniques and skills we have learnt being used in their independent writing. Some of them are very chilling indeed and not recommended reading before bedtime!

In Maths we have been learning to add and subtract decimals. We have learned it's not as scary as it looks - so long as we line up the decimal points correctly!

5BT have loved their Science investigation work this week and have been analysing 'soil samples from Mars' using Litmus paper to check the pH level.

5G have very much embraced our new Music scheme. This week we listened to Ella Fitzgerald, learned and performed some 'scatting' and had great fun performing the 'Bungalow' song.

We are looking forward to our Wonderdome workshop on Wednesday and our litter pick on Friday next week! It's going to be a busy one!





Class 6BA & 6BL

Year 6 have shown some good work ethic and resilience this week when working on practice SATs papers. It is evident that many of the children want to succeed and have tried really hard! Information from this should help inform work in school and any future booster sessions!

In Science, they made a prototype of an alarm system using circuits. If their design could be improved, they worked with their group to suggest an alternative circuit design.



They have been interpreting data from pie charts and bar graphs in Maths and using this to answer questions.

In PSHE, they have continued to plan their fundraising ideas. This is encouraging the children to consider others in the community who may be in need and what they can do to support them.

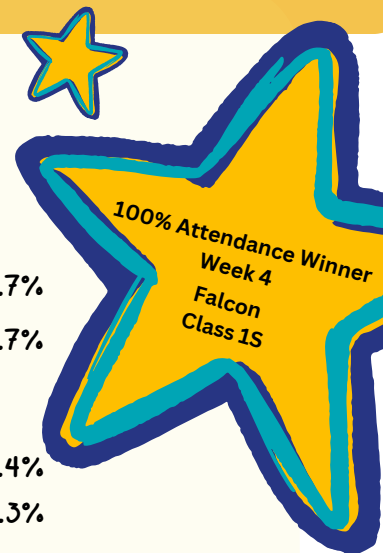

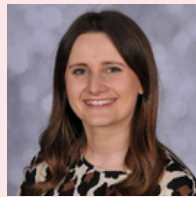
Safeguarding
