## Class OC & OS

Wow! What a busy week in EYFS. We had an amazing time at Scarborough castle, seeing all the features we have been learning about, the children were so well behaved and we were proud of their knowledge! Thank you again to the parent helpers!

In maths we have been finding and making number bonds to 10, we have been grouping objects in different ways to see how many different number bonds we could find.

We have continued our Talk for Writing unit on 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Our focus has been on creating vocabulary mats with relevant words as well as labelling the characters.

The craft area has been very busy this week, the children have been determined to make and improve their models - so much so that we have ran out of junk box modelling! Please send in any recycling you have next week!



## Year 1

### Class 1A & 1S

This week has seen us continue to learn about Queen Elizabeth II. We have used our learning to write a non-fiction text about her. A non-fiction text is very different to a fiction, have you got any non-fiction texts at home?

In maths we have started our learning about fractions. We have found half of a shape and half of a quantity. It is really important that both halves are equal.

In RE we are learning about Islam and we are fascinated. We have found out about how and where it started, their holy book the Qu'ran, about their special place called a mosque and what the wudu is.

Finally, a reminder to that your child will swap their reading book every Friday so please have their book in school. Please also read with your child at least 3 times a week. Thank you.





## Class 2S & 2MT

This week we reached the end of our reading strategy text, 'The owl who was afraid of the dark'. We loved this story and the children really impressed us with their fluency in reading. They also shared amazing ideas about Plop facing his fears and how he changed as a character.

In D&T we have been learning about nutrition and what makes a meal healthy or unhealthy. We loved exploring the fruits and vegetables on Thursday to see which had seeds. We practiced peeling, slicing and chopping the food.

In music we have been rhythm makers and composed our own rhythms using claps and taps. We were introduced to some new musical vocabulary too- can your child remember any?

We swap reading books for home on a Friday morning so please could we politely ask you to make sure children have these on a Friday along with their reading record. Thank you!

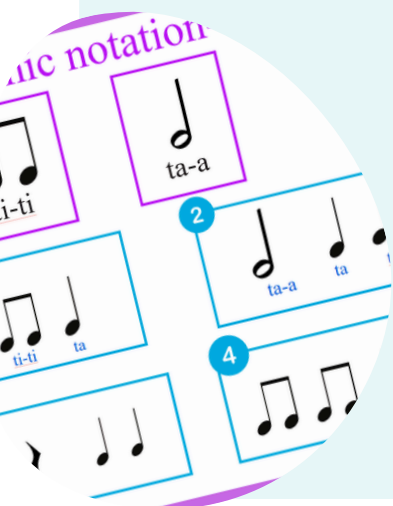


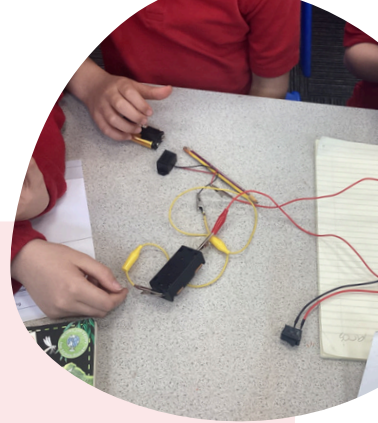
## Class 3C & 3WR

This week, the Year 3 children have been getting creative with printing techniques in art! They experimented with natural objects such as wood and shells to create unique textures before using an overprinting technique to produce artwork inspired by the artist Sam Francis.

In music, the children have been learning about the musician, David Bowie. They explored his influence on music and style while also developing their understanding of musical notation. It has been fantastic to see their enthusiasm as they begin to recognise and use different musical symbols.

Our reading sessions this week focused on a non-fiction text about the history of fireworks. The children have discovered some amazing facts—why not ask them what they remember? You could also encourage them to explain how the text was structured to help the reader find key information.



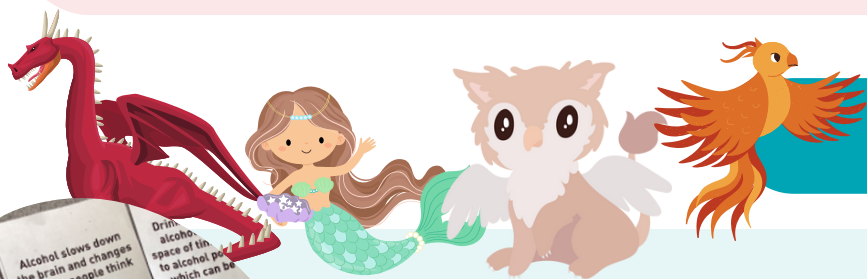


## Class 4S & 4M

This week we have continued our work on decimals, looking at ordering, rounding and equivalent decimals. The children are working hard on their MTC practise and we are seeing their scores improve each week, well done!

Our writing continues to focus on a piece of technology we might see in the year 3000, the children have thought of some brilliant ideas. I think the robot that cleans the house itself is genius!

In art we have continued to focus on the work of Naum Gabo and explored mono-block printing this week. The children produced some fantastic work. In science, we have explored switches in a circuit as we continue to learn about electricity. In PE we are continuing to work on hockey and tennis and are beginning to play some short matches.



## Class 5G & 5BT



In Year 5 we definitely have some engineers and scientists of the future! In Science we have carried out an investigation to see which pulley system would be the best at lifting a 2l drinks bottle. We used Newton meters to measure the force required. We have also learned about levers, including some found on our body! Can the children still remember where they are?

In English we have begun our information writing about our chosen mythical creatures and we have been learning to use adverbs that can indicate negative or positive facts e.g. Fascinatingly, or Abhorrently.

In PE we are continuing to develop our tennis and hockey skills. We have been thinking about which spaces to aim the ball towards and in PSHE we have continued our learning about 'Healthy Me'. This week we have been learning about alcohol and the effects that it can have on the mind and body.





## Class 6BT & 6B

Year 6 have absolutely smashed this week and we couldn't be prouder! They have worked so hard during some practice testing this week, something we are looking forward to discussing with you at the upcoming parents' evening.

The children should receive their tests back so they know what went well and where they may need a little extra work. This will also inform the learning that they will be doing daily and any future booster groups after (or during) school.

Thank you to all who attended the Peat Rigg parents' meeting, information is on its way home for those that couldn't make it. Please do not hesitate to get in touch with any worries or concerns. We know it will be an opportunity for the children to put all of their teamwork, organisational and problem solving skills to the test as well as challenges to push themselves out of their comfort zones.

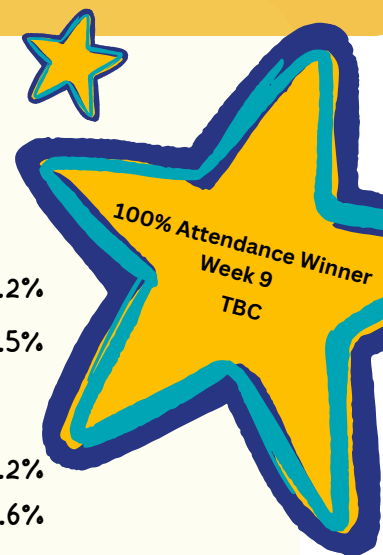
