In Science, we have been learning all about friction. The children have enjoyed discovering how friction works, and we are looking forward to testing different surfaces to find out which one creates the most friction. Let the experimenting begin!

There was a real buzz of excitement as we began our new History topic: Ancient Egypt! The children were fascinated to learn about the famous archaeologist Howard Carter and his amazing discoveries. We can't wait to uncover more secrets from the past in the weeks ahead!











Class 45 & 4M

This week in Year 4, we found our classrooms covered in green slime and some unwanted visitors had been caught on camera in our classes. We used this as inspiration for a short burst write. We have continued to look at speech and other short clips to inspire us for our 'defeating the monster' innovations that we will start next week.

In maths, we have continued to look at reading 24 hour and 12 hour clocks and in reading we have begun reading Krindlekrax, after spending some time getting to know the author and making predictions.

Science created a splash this week as we investigated sound and how sound waves travel. We loved this activity!

In Maths this week we have been learning to use protractors to measure angles, as well as drawing our own and calculating missing angles. It was tricky at first to get the protractor lined up but we are beginning to master it now!

We have enjoyed our writing this week, especially when Mr. Wriglesworth taught us the VR headset skill for writing descriptively. Ask the children about it! We have seen some fantastic descriptions of our scary house in the woods, with some very emotive language.

In Art we have been learning about line and tone, hatching, cross-hatching and smudging with different pencils and pens. Wow! We really have some talented artists in Year 5!
