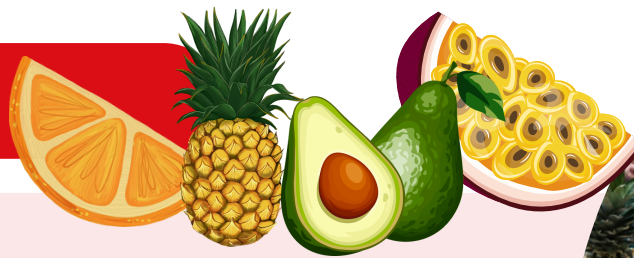

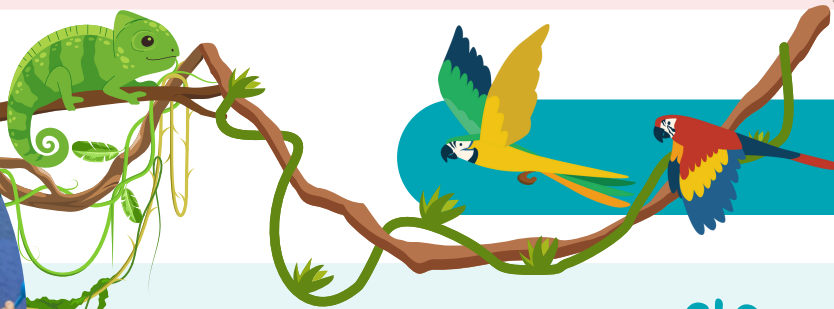
## Class OC & OS

We have had a great first week back in EYFS!

We have released our tadpoles into the wildlife pond this week. Over the last term the children have been fantastic investigators, observing and writing fact books about them.

We have begun our new Talk for Writing text 'Handa's Surprise'. We had a special delivery of exotic fruits, like the ones seen in the story. We talked about how these fruits are grown in hot countries, like ones in Africa, where Handa is from. We smelt and tasted the fruits; some children even found their new favourite fruit!

In maths we have been sharing and grouping, with a focus on the vocabulary 'equal' and 'unequal'.



Year 1

## Class 1A & 1S

We've had a busy and exciting week in Year 1!

In Maths, we've been learning about capacity and volume. The children explored different ways to show full, half full, empty, and nearly empty using water and containers. They really enjoyed the hands-on activities!

In English, we've been discovering animals that live in the rainforest. The children used their knowledge to create fantastic poems, full of imagination and descriptive language.

In Art, we explored the difference between outlines and silhouettes. The children have started to create some lovely art work.

Well done to everyone for their hard work!







## Class 2S & 2Mt

Wow! What a great start to the new term we've had in Year 2!

In maths, we have started our new topic on capacity and have been learning about measuring in grams and kilograms. The children have been reading scales and comparing amounts.

In our Reading lessons we're continuing with our story George's Marvelous Medicine and are excited to see what the medicine will turn out like, once George has boiled it up!

Our Science topic is living things and their habitats and we explored the woodland area, looking for things that were alive, dead and never been alive. Our most exciting find was the frog in the forest schools area!

Our Writing focus this term is rags to riches and we are hoping we can take good care of Pirate Tom's treasure!



## Year 3

### Class 3C & 3WR

This week in History, the children learned how Ancient Egyptians farmed along the River Nile, using its floods to grow crops. They spotted similarities with Bronze Age and Iron Age farming, like using simple tools and growing wheat and barley.

In our Reading sessions, we have been exploring how the author, E.B. White, introduced Charlotte's clever plan to save Wilbur the pig. We looked closely at the words he used to show how the characters were feeling.

In Maths, we have been learning about capacity and volume. The children have been comparing amounts and reading scales. It would be great if they could keep practising at home by reading scales on different jugs and measuring cylinders. You could ask questions like, "If I added 200ml more, how much liquid would there be?" to help build their confidence.



## Year 4

### Class 4S & 4M



This week Year 4 have begun a new writing unit on quest stories. They had a go at writing one about Tom Trueheart and his quest to find his brothers. They have also looked and choosing adventurous vocabulary to describe their characters as brave, courageous and bold. In maths we have begun a unit on angles and have been identifying acute, obtuse and right angles.



We have continued our DT project this week and have designed our Mayan patis (vests), created templates and are beginning to sew seams and hems to attach the material together. We finished off our history unit on the ancient Maya and we are looking forward to our new geography topic on North America that we will start next week.



## Year 5

### Class 5G & 5BT

This week, year 5 have been completing their first set of practice SATs, in preparation for next year. They have worked so hard, and all the adults are very proud of their resilience and determination. Well done everyone!

We have also learned about reversible and irreversible changes in science. The children loved watching the adults desperately try to make popcorn, and fail miserably. The kernels all but turned to ash in the experiment - an irreversible change nonetheless.

Moving on, we have also started to learn about units of measure in maths, with the children learning to convert between mm, cm, m and km, and in music the children composing music on Garage Band.

Well done on an amazing week year 5 - you have really done yourselves proud.







## Class 6BT & 6B

This week, the children have been busy preparing for Sports Days which start next week. We have asked the children to come ready in their PE kits Monday to Thursday as they will be running Sports Days, however on Wednesday, it would be great if they could wear a top to represent their DREAMS team (as it is their own Sports Day in the morning).

They have started practising songs in anticipation for the Year 6 play. Please could you start thinking about possible costumes - we will be sending out guidance on this shortly.

In PE, they had the pleasure of doing a special tag rugby session, something they will continue to do periodically over the next few weeks.

They have finished their final draft compositions for their artwork inspired by Henri Rousseau - they will be starting their final pieces next week.

Well done to 2S, 2MT and 5G who all won an attendance reward this week and will celebrate with popcorn, movies and crazy hair!



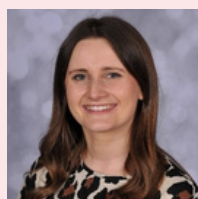
