Last Friday, the children stepped into the shoes of Ancient Egyptian engineers as they designed and built their own shadufs—a clever tool invented over 4,000 years ago to lift water from the River Nile to irrigate crops. We were incredibly impressed by their teamwork, creativity, and problem-solving skills!

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In Art, the children began exploring different clay techniques, including coiling, hollowing, and pinching. These new skills will come in handy later this term when they create their very own Ancient Egyptian Canopic Jars.

Year 4

Class 45 & 4M

This week Year 4 have continued their reading of the book Krindlekrax. We have enjoyed reading Winston's flashbacks to the time that he stole a crocodile from the zoo where he worked. In maths, we have continued to look at shape- exploring regular and irregular polygons and their properties. In English, we have explored Show Not Tell and ways that this can be used in a great opening for our impending quest stories..

In science, we looked at chemical reactions between an alkali and an acid (bicarbonate of soda and vinegar). We observed how a gas is produced as a result of the reaction, and in history we learned about the English Civil War and the execution of King Charles I. We also enjoyed our sports day this week - the children really enjoyed competing in their teams. Well done all on anther fantastic week!
