



Art Excellence at Filey School




The Summer Book Fair

Over the past few weeks, our Year 11 students have continued to benefit from masterclasses and additional intervention sessions, designed to provide every bit of support and guidance as they head into their final examinations. We are now halfway through the science exams, and feedback from students has been very positive so far.

For Year 10, trial examinations will begin the week commencing Monday 16th June. I am fully aware that this academic year has seen some disruptions to learning due to building works, staff changes, and curriculum adjustments. To support our students ahead of their trial exams, the Science Department will be running three two-hour masterclasses — one for each discipline: Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. These sessions will help bridge knowledge gaps and provide exam tips, techniques, and strategies.

Years 7, 8, and 9 will also be taking their end-of-year assessments starting the week of Monday 16th June. Revision activities have already begun in lessons to help consolidate learning and ensure students are well-prepared.

We have recently seen a noticeable improvement in engagement with Sparx Science homework, and I want to thank you for your continued support. However, we did notice a dip in completion rates over the half-term break. This suggests that the routine of completing Sparx Science homework on a weekly basis is not yet fully embedded.

Please note that Sparx Science homework is now tailored specifically to support all upcoming assessments and trial exams. It plays a crucial role in reinforcing classroom learning and building long-term recall — both of which are essential for exam success and future outcomes beyond Filey School.

A reminder about Sparx Science homework:

- Set every Wednesday at 9:00am
- Due by 10:00pm the following Tuesday
- Tasks usually take 15–20 minutes to complete


How you can help:

- A watch may be worn, but smartwatches are not permitted.








Attendance Matters!

We have a duty of care to ensure your child's safety as well as their regular school attendance.

If your child is going to be absent you must contact school before 9:10am every day your child is absent. Contact can be made via the MCAS mobile phone app, or by calling 01723 512354.

For safeguarding reasons, we operate a 48-hour visual policy during absences from Filey School when no contact has been made to the academy, by parents of guardians. Home visits may be conducted on day 3 of absence, if daily contact has been made to the academy. Home visits may be more frequent at the discretion of the Head of the School, Attendance team or safeguarding team. During home visits, a student must be visually seen by staff of Filey School. For safeguarding reasons, it may be necessary to request Police welfare home visits and / or social care support.
